In the course of later action, it was also determined that Religious Ed. should take over responsibility of maintaining the pamphlet & brochure rack from the Library.

The other major point of debate for the evening centered around adoption of a budget to last from the beginning of the year until the next Annual Meeting, when a new budget will be proposed for action by the congregation, per a motion passed at the last Annual Meeting. This interim budget is based upon the figures shown in the Excel spreadsheet on page 3.

This budget is significantly larger than last year's, which was quite successful in 1) finally making up for the losses incurred by the 50th Anniversary and 2) having the least amount of expenditures of the last few years. This budget takes into account lessons learned during the past year and antici

pates an expanded role for select Subcommittees, RE being one. One disturbing note was that our bank account dropped at one point last year to about \$4000. Now, if one subtracts last year's Actual Expenses from THIS year's budget, the difference is around \$5000! The closeness of those two figures explains why it was decided to table for later consideration the motion passed at the Annual Meeting which made it mandatory for the Exec. Comm. to OPTIONALY consider putting some of our "excess" monies into a CD or some other interest bearing vehicle. Perhaps things will be clearer by the next time it is brought up.

The only other piece of business actually finalized was the decision to purchase a packet of UU bumper stickers from the UU Bookstore and urge the membership to purchase them for \$2 and use them to engage the public at large in a discussion of what UU philosophy is all about. This is a part of the Uncommon Denomination program initiated at the Annual Meeting and there will be

a lot more about this sort of thing as time progresses.

Discussed and assigned for further investigation were a handyman to take the load off of **Kerry**, whereas a cleaning person to take the load off of all of us was approved pending **Twyla's** successful search. (We aren't getting any younger...)

The six hymnals authorized at the last meeting are here and stowed in the bookshelf in the foyer alongside the others.

Executive Meeting dates have been standardized as being on the third Monday of the month. Hence, the next Executive Committee meeting will be held August 21 at **Liesl's**.

The size of our website has just taken a jump upward by a factor of about a third or so. The new area is accessed only by a brown "button" at the top right on the Main Page (or Home Page) labeled "Fellowship".
