New Minister Called

When Chuck Thomas informed us that he would be unable to continue as our minister last September 18th, the Executive Committee formed a Search Committee at its very next meeting. By sheer chance, that meeting had already been scheduled for the very next night!

The Search Committee met to organize itself (and its collective thoughts) on October 3rd. The members of the Search Committee were the Bells, the Wilsons, Louise Daniels, Adaline Bridges and Kerry Snyder. A lot of very heart-felt discussion resulted in the decision to proceed with the search for Chuck's replacement.

Now the tale takes a personal turn. Your friendly neighborhood congregational president decided to phone Chuck and ask what seemed a very logical question at the time. "Do you know of anyone in the Dayton area who might be interested in your position?" Chuck responded that he knew of a lady who was in training to become a hospital chaplain and might be able to serve our needs for perhaps up to a year. We left it at that, with Chuck's promise to get back to me with her views on the subject.

When he did call back, it was with surprising news—Richard Venus had resigned

from the Dayton church to take a half-time ministry at the New Madison church. Chuck felt that perhaps he might be interested in also serving as our quarter-time minister. I asked him to sound Richard out on our behalf and the next thing that I knew Richard and I were discussing possibilities in a very positive phone call.

Engaging the active cooperation of our Program Chairman, Don Mack, the schedule was reshuffled to allow Richard to speak on October 16th. Immediately following that service, the Search Committee met with Richard upstairs in the Board Room. (Well, what WILL be our Board Room when we get it remodeled.) A list of ministerial functions that Chuck had performed in the past was discussed with Richard, with the resulting acknowledgement that he was willing to provide those services with the understanding that there may be times that he is simply unavailable to do so. Since that was essentially the same arrangement that Chuck had with us, there seemed to be no issues. We parted with Richard asking us to make contact with the UUA to see if they were aware of anyone who was closer or even locally situated of whom we were NOT aware. Subsequent inquiry with both the UUA and the Heartland District proved negative. We had already made contact with the only area

minister willing to take on the task.

The very next evening, October 17, the Search Committee met again to decide whether or not to proceed with recommending to the Executive Committee that Richard be called to serve. The recommendation that was adopted was to offer Richard an annual mutually renewable contract identical to Chuck's.

On October 23rd, the Executive Committee met immediately after the service to take action on the Search Committee's recommendation. The recommendation was approved after the usual round of UU debate and discussion. This cleared the way for final approval by the congregation.

Postcards giving notice of a Special Congregational Meeting to Vote to Call were sent out by the Secretary, Marilyn Bell. That meeting was called to order immediately after the Covenant on November 13th. The vote to call was passed by a significantly overwhelming majority. As a result, Richard will speak to us for the first time as our minister on December 11th.

At the regularly scheduled Executive Committee meeting on November 14th, the Search Committee rose and reported itself out of existence, having fulfilled its function.

Therefore, the Library Committee is putting out a plea for donations of books. They should be in good condition, old or recent, new or used, fiction or non-fiction. Subject matter can vary widely: religion, ethics, philosophy; history, biography, travel, geography; nature, biology and other sciences, ecology, astronomy; social and political analysis or commentary, government; art, music, drama including librettos and scripts; children's books (all ages); and fiction (novels, historical fiction, science fiction). CDs, DVDs and VHS tapes are also welcome and will be separately shelved for easy access. Eventually, the Library will be organized enough that we will welcome donations of art and other exhibits. If you like, the name of the donor (book donors, too) can be inscribed.
